

A DEPORTATION TAKES PLACE ON BOARD OF YOUR FLIGHT. WHAT YOU CAN DO AS A PASSENGER:

WHEN CHECKING IN: SPEAK OUT AGAINST THE DEPORTATION

When check-in consult the staff of the airline and speak out against the planned deportation of the current flight. Make the staff aware, that you don't accept, that the airline deport people against their will. In this way, the airline delivers dangers to the deportees at their destination. Make it clear that a deportation isn't a regular transportation, but a violent act in which a lot of deportees already were injured by the police.

ADDRESS THE PILOT

Before the departure of the plane, you can contact the captain and ask her or him to cancel the deportation in regard of humanitarian reasons. You can go to the cockpit or ask the staff to get the captain. The captain has the authority and is responsible for the safety of passengers. Therefore **she or he can stop the transport of passengers if they don't fly voluntarily.**

PROTEST ON BOARD

Protest on board loudly, to attract the **attention** of the other passengers. As long as you **don't sit down** and **don't strap on**, the flight can't start. Advertise that you **won't fly with the airline anymore**, if they won't leave the business of deportation.

CONTACT THE PERSON CONCERNED

Speak to the person concerned in the airplane. Nobody can't forbid it. **Ask her or him, if she or he needs support.** Don't accept the use of **force** against her or him by the federal police. You can obtain, that the policing powers of the officers legally end with the closing of the doors of the plane. Document the processes on board, if possible with photos or videos.

If the deportation of person concerned is carried out, observe what will happen **after the arrival** with the person concerned at the airport.
